AN ORDINANCE to prohibit the flying of kites
within certain limits.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. Whoever shall fly or attempt to fly any kite in any place within the limits of any Borough, or in any other place which may hereafter be specified by Proclamation of the Governor under this Ordinance, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on summary conviction before any Justice of the Peace forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Five Pounds and in default of payment shall be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding one month. ~

Flying of kites prohibited in Boroughs.

Police to
destroy.

2. It shall be lawful for any Police Constable to destroy any kite which any person shall fly or attempt to fly in contravention of this Ordinance.

Not to apply
to Queen's
Park, Port-of
Spain.

3. This Ordinance shall not apply to the flying of kites within the limits of the Queen's Park in the Town of Port-of-Spain.

Tobago.

4. This Ordinance shall not apply to Tobago.
