**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of  
Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent  
of the Legislative Council as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Harbours Short title  
Ordinance, 1896.

This Ordinance shall be read and construed as one Construction.  
with the Harbours Ordinance, 1880, hereinafter called  
the principal Ordinance.

The principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may  
together be cited as the Harbours Ordinances, 1880 and  
1896.

Repeal.

2. Section 34 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

License fees.

The following shall be the fees payable for licenses for boats whether propelled by steam or otherwise, and boatmen.

*Boats.*

For 10 passengers or under	....	5/0
„ 15 „ „ „	....	7/6
„ 20 „ „ „	....	15/0
„ 40 „ „ „	....	30/0
„ 50 „ „ „	....	37/6

*Boatmen.*

For every licensed boatman .... 5/0

Such fees shall be paid to the Harbour Master granting the license for the use, if paid to the Harbour Master of the San Fernando Harbour, of the Mayor and Burgesses of San Fernando, and in all other cases for the use of Her Majesty for the purposes of this Colony.

Penalty for clearing without certificate.

3. If the Master of any vessel shall depart or sail from any Port in the Colony, or if the Agent of any vessel shall clear or cause any such vessel to be cleared without a certificate from a Harbour Master certifying that all things required to be complied with by

- (1.) The principal Ordinance.
- (2.) Any Act of Parliament relating to Merchant Shipping.
- (3.) The Infirm Paupers Ordinance, 1882, (5-1882) or any Ordinance extending or amending the same

have been respectively complied with, every such Master or Agent shall be guilty of an offence against this

Ordinance, and on conviction thereof before any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £10, and in default of payment shall be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months.

4. In addition to the powers vested in the Governor and Vice Admiral by Section 63 of the Harbours Ordinance, 1880, there shall be vested in him the power to make, alter or revoke regulations as to the carrying of lights by vessels and for the doing of all such other things as he may deem necessary for better ensuring the safety of persons and of vessels within all Harbours. Power to make Rules.

5. The repeal by this Ordinance shall not affect the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered, or any right accrued or liability incurred before the commencement of this Ordinance, or any proceeding pending or uncompleted at the commencement of this Ordinance. Saving.

6. This Ordinance shall not apply to Tobago.
