No. 211.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Port-of-Spain (Amendment) Ordinance, 1912.

Alteration of boundaries.

2. The Schedule to the Port-of-Spain Ordinance, No. 211, is hereby amended by substituting for the Eastern and Northern boundaries there set out the following:—

On the East.—A straight line drawn due North from the Sea through the South-eastern corner of the Powder Magazine to a point 100 yards due North of the Belmont Valley road.

On the North.—A line drawn in a Westerly direction from the Northern terminus of the Eastern boundary, parallel to and at a distance of 100 yards to the North of the Belmont Valley road and the Belmont Circular road till it meets the Circular road, thence along the Northern side of the Circular road till it meets the turn to Maraval.

Passed in Council this Eleventh day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve.
