AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, No. 210.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipal Cor- Short Title.

2. Section 31 of the Municipal Corporations Ordinance Amendment

“Provided also that any Officer in the Public Service of the Colony who obtains within five days after notice of his election a certificate of exemption from the Governor on the ground that the public duties of such Officer do not allow of his accepting such office, shall not be liable to such fine as aforesaid.”

Resignation
by Public
Officer.

3. Any Officer in the Public Service who shall be elected to the office of Councillor or Auditor or who shall be selected for the office of Mayor may, by the direction of the Governor, at any time resign any such office by writing signed by such officer and delivered to the Town Clerk and Treasurer, and notwithstanding anything contained in the Municipal Corporations Ordinance (No. 210) no such Officer shall be liable to any fine in consequence of such resignation.
