AN ORDINANCE to amend the War Censorship
Ordinance, 1914.

[11th November, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the War Censorship (Amendment) Ordinance, 1915.

Amendment
of Section 6
of 38—1914.

2. Section 6 of the War Censorship Ordinance, 1914, is amended.

(1.) By striking out all after the word "section" in line 5 of Sub-section (4) and adding in lieu thereof the words "is guilty of a felony and is liable upon conviction on indictment to a fine not exceeding £500, or to imprisonment, with hard labour, for any period not exceeding five years, or to both,"

(2.) By inserting as Sub-section (5) the following :—

(5.) Nothing contained in this section shall affect the liability of any person to trial and punishment for any offence under any other Ordinance or at Common Law so that he is not twice punished for the same offence.

3. Section 10 of the War Censorship Ordinance, 1914 is amended by adding at the commencement thereof the words "Subject to the express provisions of this Ordinance." Amendment of Section 10 of 38—1914.
