AN ORDINANCE to amend the Quarantine Ordinances.

[29th December, 1915.]

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the Quarantine Ordinance, 1910, this Colony entered into, adopted and adhered to the Convention set out in the First Schedule to that Ordinance:

And Whereas there also have adhered or acceded to the said Convention the Colonies of British Guiana, Barbados and the Windward and Leeward Islands;

And Whereas by Article 8 of the said Convention no alteration or modification thereof can be made without the consent of all the Colonies adhering or acceding thereto;

And Whereas all the said Colonies have consented to the amendment of the said Convention in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Quarantine Short Title.
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1915.

2. The following article shall be inserted in the said Amendment
Convention as Article 3A, and shall be deemed for all of Convention.
purposes to form part thereof :—

3A. When any place within a Colony has ceased to be infected as defined in the Quarantine Regulations annexed to the present Convention, such Colony shall notify by telegram to the other Colonies the date of the last case of infectious or contagious disease and that the measures required by the said Quarantine Regulations have been taken since that date.

Passed in Council this Seventeenth day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.
