AN ORDINANCE relating to the cutting of trees in certain cases.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cutting of trees Short title.
(Notice) Ordinance 1911.

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to trim, cut or fell any tree growing or being within fifty feet of any works of the Trinidad Electric Company, Limited, or their successors, unless he shall have given twenty-four hours previous notice of such intended trimming, cutting or felling to the said Company. Trees within 50 feet of works of Electric Company.

In this section the term "works" shall have the meaning given to it by Section 6 of Ordinance No. 246.

Penalty.

3. Any person who trims cuts or fells any tree in contravention of the provisions of Section 2 hereof, shall be guilty of an offence and on summary conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds.
