BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the District Court (Additional powers) Ordinance 1911.

Additional powers of Commissioner.

2. In addition to the powers conferred upon him by the Petty Civil Courts Ordinance 1911, the Commissioner of the Port-of-Spain District Court shall have all the powers and jurisdiction conferred upon a Stipendiary Justice of the Peace by the following Ordinances, that is to say:—

3. For the purposes of the above-mentioned Ordinances ^{Clerks.} the Chief Clerk and the Second Clerk in the Office of the said Commissioner shall be deemed to be "Clerks" within the meaning of the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance No. 1.

4. This Ordinance shall commence on such day as the ^{Commence-} Governor may by Proclamation appoint. _{ment.}
