AN ORDINANCE to amend the Local Forces Ordinances,
Nos. 131 and 7 of 1905.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Forces Short title. Ordinance 1911. It shall be read as one with Ordinance No. 131 and the Local Forces (Amendment) Ordinance No. 7 of 1905.

2. It shall be lawful for any member of the Territorial Forces of the United Kingdom to be attached with the permission in writing of his Commanding Officer to the Local Forces of the Colony for his annual training, provided that the full course of training for any one year be performed in the Colony and that such attachment shall not exceed a total period of three years, and on the satisfactory completion of any such training any such

member of the Territorial Forces of the United Kingdom so attached to the Local Forces shall be entitled to a certificate from the officer commanding the unit with which he trains that such training has been satisfactorily performed, and during the time that any member of the Territorial Forces is so attached, he shall be subject to the provisions of any Ordinance, rule or regulation then in force in the Colony relating to the unit of the Local Forces of the Colony to which he may be attached. The pay and allowances of any such member of the Territorial Forces of the United Kingdom while training with the Local Forces of the Colony shall be such as he would receive if with his own corps and shall be recoverable by the Government of Trinidad from Imperial Army Funds.

3. It shall be lawful for any member of the Local Forces of the Colony to be attached, with the permission in writing of the Commandant of the Local Forces of the Colony, to any unit of the Imperial Forces of the United Kingdom for his annual training, provided that the full course of training for any one year be done with such unit, and while so attached he shall be subject to the provisions of any laws and regulations to which the corps to which he is attached is subject, and shall during the period of such attachment receive pay and allowances at the rate laid down for one of his rank and arm of the service in the unit to which he is attached, such pay and allowances to be recoverable from the Government of Trinidad.

Course of
training.

4. Each course of training satisfactorily performed by any member of the Local Forces of the Colony with any Imperial unit, or by any member of any Imperial unit with the Local Forces shall be accepted for record and count towards efficiency in the same manner as if it had been performed with the corps to which the person so attached belongs.

Army
Reservists.

5. All Army Reservists are liable for service only as soldiers of the Regular Forces; if they are required to be called out for permanent service by the Imperial Government they shall be so called out by the Colonial Government and conveyed, at the cost of the Imperial Government, to such place as the latter may direct; and when

so called upon for permanent service, pending their delivery on board ship or to the Imperial Military Authorities, shall while so awaiting embarkation be subject to any Ordinance, rule, or regulation, then in force in the Colony, relating to the unit of the Local Forces to which they may be attached by the Commandant of the Local Forces.
