AN ORDINANCE to amend the Roads Ordinance, No. 200.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Roads Ordinance, 1911.

Power to destroy swine straying on or damaging Public Roads.

2. All swine found straying on or damaging any Public Main Road may be destroyed by any person authorized in writing by any District Officer of the Public Works Department; and all swine found straying on or damaging any Local Road may be destroyed by any person authorized in writing by the Road Officer of the Local Road Board of the District or by the District Officer of the Public Works Department in Districts where there is no Local Road Board, and all swine so destroyed may be buried by the authorized person unless their carcases are claimed by the owner of the swine within six hours of their destruction.

Timber for Public Road.

3. The powers conferred by Section 13 of the Roads Ordinance, No. 200 upon the Director of Public Works or

any person authorized by him or his servants and agents shall be deemed to extend to the cutting and carrying away of timber for any purpose in connection with the construction or maintenance of or the preparation of materials for use on a Public road.

4. Sub-section (c) of Section 9 of Ordinance No. 288 shall be read as if the words "annually recurrent" in the fifth and sixth lines thereof had not been included therein. Amendment of Section 9 of Ordinance 288.
