AN ORDINANCE to amend the Lepers' Ordinance, No. 190.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Citation.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Lepers (amending) Ordinance, 1911, and shall be read as one with the Lepers' Ordinance, No. 190, which is hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 17 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following shall be inserted in lieu thereof:—

When any leper is committed to take his trial or for further examination or is sentenced to imprisonment for any offence or for the non-payment of any money or penalty, the Court ordering the commitment or inflicting the imprisonment shall direct the leper to be committed to a Leper Asylum there to be kept or there to undergo his sentence of imprisonment as the case may be.

3. Section 18 of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting:—

- (a.) the words "committed or" after the word "lepers" in the third line thereof:—
- (b.) the words "so committed or" after the word "lepers" in the seventh line thereof.
