AN ORDINANCE to amend the Wills and Probate Ordinance, No. 99.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Wills and Probate Ordinance (Amendment) Ordinance, 1911, and shall be read as one with the Wills and Probate Ordinance, No. 99, which is hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short title.

2. In this Ordinance the term "Public Trustee" means the Public Trustee as defined in the Act of the Imperial Parliament entitled "the Public Trustee Act, 1906" or any Act amending the same. Interpretation. (6 Edw. 7 C. 55).

3. The Court may grant probate or letters of administration to the Public Trustee by that name. Court may grant probate to Public Trustee.

Public Trustee
not required to
give security.

4. The Public Trustee shall be added to the persons mentioned in Section 68 of the principal Ordinance as being persons not required to give security for the due administration of estates, and the provisions of that section shall apply to the Public Trustee in all respects as if he had been named therein.
