AN ORDINANCE to amend the Industrial Schools Ordinance, No. 30.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Industrial Schools (Amendment) Ordinance, 1911, and shall be read as one with the Industrial Schools Ordinance, No. 30, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, the Industrial Schools Ordinance 1906, (23-1906) and the Industrial Schools Ordinance, 1908, (46-1908.) This Ordinance and the three last mentioned Ordinances may be cited together as the Industrial Schools Ordinances.

2. The provisions of Section 33 of the principal Ordinance shall apply to the putative father of an illegitimate child in all respects as if such putative father had been expressly named in that section.

3. Upon the hearing of a complaint against any person in respect of the maintenance of an illegitimate child in an Industrial School, if it be alleged in the complaint that such person is the father of the child, the Court may adjudge him to be the father thereof; but shall not so adjudge him upon the evidence of the mother, unless her evidence be corroborated in some material particular.

Provided always that the amount directed to be paid by a putative father under this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance shall not exceed, together with the amount payable under a maintenance order, if any, under the Bastardy Ordinance, No. 3, the sum of four shillings per week, and that the Court making an order under this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may direct that any amount payable under a maintenance order under Ordinance No. 3, shall for the future be paid to the Inspector of Industrial Schools and to the extent thereof be applied towards the payment of the amount made payable by an order under this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance.

Passed in Council this Fourth day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
