AN ORDINANCE to amend the District Court (additional powers) Ordinance, 1911.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the District Court ^{Short title.} (Additional Powers) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1911 and shall be read as one with the District Court (Additional Powers) Ordinance, 1911 (No. 8) which is hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. From and after the commencement of this Ordinance ^{Exclusive jurisdiction of Commissioner.} the Stipendiary Justice of the Peace for the Town of Port-of-Spain and the Western District of the County of St. George shall cease to have, or exercise any of the powers, authority or jurisdiction conferred on a Stipendiary Justice of the Peace by any of the Ordinances set forth in Section 2

of the principal Ordinance, but all such powers, authority and jurisdiction are declared to be hereby transferred to and vested in the Commissioner of the Port-of-Spain District Court.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall affect the jurisdiction of such Stipendiary Justice conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Reformatory Schools Ordinance No. 29.

Transfer of pending business.

3. All matters and proceedings whatsoever under any of the Ordinances set forth in Section 2 of the principal Ordinance which shall be pending in the Court of the Stipendiary Justice of the Peace of Port-of-Spain shall be continued and concluded in the Port-of-Spain District Court, and such last named Court shall have the same powers, authority and jurisdiction in relation to all such matters and proceedings as if the same had been commenced and continued therein down to the point at which the transfer takes place.

Transfer of books and papers to District Court.

4. All books, documents and papers in the possession of the Stipendiary Justice of the Peace of Port-of-Spain or of any officer or person attached to his Court, as such officer, or by reason of his being so attached, relating to any of the matters or proceedings in the preceding section mentioned shall be transferred to the Port-of-Spain District Court and shall be dealt with by such officer or person in such manner as the Commissioner may direct.
