AN ORDINANCE to provide that the Crown Law Officers be entitled to practise in the Courts of the Colony *ex officio*.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

- Short Title. **1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Crown Law Officers Ordinance, 1912.
- Attorney and Solicitor-General to be barristers *ex officio*. **2.** Every person holding the Office of Attorney-General or Solicitor-General shall, so long as he continues to hold such office, be deemed to be a barrister of the Supreme Court of Trinidad and Tobago *ex officio*.
- Crown Solicitor to be a Solicitor *ex officio*. **3.** Notwithstanding anything contained in the Solicitors Ordinance, 1912, or in any Ordinance amending or substituted for the same, every person holding the office of Crown Solicitor shall, so long as he continues to hold such office, be deemed to be a Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Trinidad and Tobago *ex officio*.
