BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Dogs (Muzzling) Amendment Ordinance, 1912, and shall be read as one with the Dogs (Muzzling) Ordinance, 1911, which is hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short Title.

2. Any person who, while a proclamation under Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is in operation, permits any dog to go at large without being muzzled in the manner prescribed under Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is liable on conviction before a Magistrate to a penalty not exceeding £2. Penalty for permitting unmuzzled dog to be at large.
