An Ordinance to amend the Employment of Women Ordinance, 1912, (No. 13.)

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Employment of Women (Amendment) Ordinance, 1912, and shall be read as one with the Employment of Women Ordinance, 1912, which is hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is amended:—

(a.) By striking out the word “and” where it first occurs in line 4 of the definition of “Industrial Undertaking” and inserting in lieu thereof the word “or.” and

(b.) By striking out all the words after the word "undertaking" in line 1 of the definition of "Night work" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "during any portion of a period of 11 consecutive hours including the hours of 10 o'clock in the evening and five o'clock in the morning."
