BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Indictable Offences Short Title.
(Magistrates' Procedure) Ordinance, 1912, and shall be read as one with the Indictable Offences (Magistrates' Procedure) Ordinance, No. 2, which is hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 9 of the principal Ordinance is amended by striking out the following words:—

- (b.) "or give security" in line 12 thereof;

of Ordinance

3. Section 14 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after the word "time" in line 7 thereof the words "not exceeding ten clear days or until the next day on which the Justice holds a Court if a Court is not to be held within such ten days."
