AN ORDINANCE to amend the Industrial Schools Ordinance, No. 30.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Industrial Schools Short title. Ordinance 1906, and shall be read as one with the Industrial Schools Ordinance, No. 30, hereinafter called the principal Ordinance. The principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may be cited together as the Industrial Schools Ordinances 1905-6.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 11 of the principal Ordinance, it shall be lawful for any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace, on being requested so to do by the Managers of an Industrial School, to make an order extending the time of detention of any person sent to an Industrial School under Section 9 of the principal Ordinance, for such term as may be deemed expedient by such Justice. Provided that such order shall not in any case extend the Extension of period of detention.

period of detention beyond the time at which the person in respect of whom it is made will attain the age of eighteen years.

Section 26 of the principal Ordinance shall not apply to any person in respect of whom any order under this section is made.
