AN ORDINANCE to amend the Fire Brigades Ordinance,
No. 289.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fire Brigades Ordinance 1906, and shall be read as one with the Fire Brigades Ordinance No. 289. The latter Ordinance and this Ordinance may be cited together as the Fire Brigades Ordinances 1905-6. Short title.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor with the consent of the Legislative Council to authorize the payment from the Colonial Treasury of such annual sum of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses incurred in furnishing Brigades with such fire-engines, fire-escapes, horses, accoutrements, tools and instruments as may be required for the complete equipment of a Brigade or conducive to the efficient performance of its duties, and in providing hydrants Annual grant for equipment.

for the purpose of extinguishing fires, and all such other appliances as may be required for the protection of life and property from fire.

Passed in Council this Twenty-third day of July, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six.
