AN ORDINANCE to amend the Immigration Ordinance  
No. 161.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Immigration Short title.  
(Amendment) Ordinance 1909.

It shall be read as one with the Immigration Ordinance Construction.  
No. 161, the Immigration (Amendment) Ordinance 1905  
(22—1905) and the Immigration Ordinance 1908 (15—1908).

2. In Sub-section (2) of Section 16 of the Immigration Amendment  
Ordinance No. 161, after the word "Protector," shall be of Section 16  
read the words "or any Inspector." of Ordinance  
161.

3. In Section 71 of the Immigration Ordinance No. 161, Amendment  
in lieu of the words "thirtieth day of June" wherever the of Sect on 71  
same occur, shall be read the words "thirtieth day of of Ordinance  
September." 161.

Repeal. 4. Section 74 of the Immigration Ordinance No. 161 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

Consequences  
of excessive  
death-rate.

74. Where the mean death-rate of any plantation as shown by the death-rate returns is excessive, it shall not be lawful for the Protector, unless under the authority of the Governor signified by writing under his hand, to accept any application for immigrants in respect of such plantation for the year following the day up to which the returns are made, nor shall he in any subsequent year, unless satisfied that an allotment may be made with due regard to the health of the allotted immigrants, make any such allotment.

Passed in Council this First day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.
