AN ORDINANCE to amend the Elementary Education Ordinance No. 147.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Elementary Short title. Education Ordinance 1909. It shall be read with the Elementary Education Ordinance No. 147, the Elementary Education (Amendment) Ordinance No. 238, and the Elementary Education Ordinance 1906 (2—1906).

2. In Sub-section (9) of Section 10 of the Elementary Repeal. Education Ordinance No. 147 the following words are hereby repealed:—

“Provided also that a school hereafter established
 “by private persons shall not be entitled to
 “receive aid from public funds unless the Board
 “shall have decided previous to its establish-
 “ment that such school is a necessary school.”

and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

Aid to schools
established
without
consent of
Board.

Provided also that a school hereafter established by private persons shall not be entitled to claim aid from public funds unless the Board shall have decided previous to its establishment that such school is a necessary school.

Provided always that where a school has been established without the previous decision of the Board that it is a necessary school, the Board may nevertheless grant aid from public funds to such school if the Board shall at any time decide that such school is a necessary school.

Passed in Council this Fifteenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.
