AN ORDINANCE to provide for the extinguishment of certain rights of way and of user.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the extinguishment of the rights of way and of user heretofore existing on over and along that plot of land in the Town of Port-of-Spain described in the Schedule hereto: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. The right of the public to pass and repass on over and along

- (a.) the ground formerly part of Charlotte Street lying between the Southern line of South Quay and the sea, and
- (b.) any other part, track, street, roadway, footway or path of or on the plot of land described in the Schedule hereto

shall be and the same is hereby extinguished.

2. All right of user and occupation heretofore exercised by the public, whether created by grant, license or howsoever otherwise in or over and upon the said plot of land, shall be and the same is hereby extinguished.

3. Provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation authorize the use and occupation by the public of such portion of the said plot of land as shall not be required for the purposes of the Trinidad Government railway, and the making opening and maintaining for the use of the public upon such terms and conditions respectively as he may think fit of streets and roadways or other thoroughfares on the plot of land described in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

All that plot of land in the Town of Port-of-Spain abutting on the North upon the Southern line of the thoroughfare known as South Quay, on the South upon the sea, on the East upon the Dry River and on the West on the prolongation of the Eastern side of Broadway to the sea.
