AN ORDINANCE to amend the law relating to  
Vaccination in Tobago.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient that the Ordinances relating to Vaccination in force in Tobago should be repealed and that the Ordinances in force in Trinidad relating to the same subject be extended to and be in force in Tobago: Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tobago Vaccination Ordinance, 1903.

2. The Tobago Ordinances Nos. 3 of 1882 and 4 of 1883 are hereby repealed, and the Trinidad Ordinances Nos. 23 of 1872 and 20 of 1900 shall from and after the commencement of this Ordinance extend to and be in force in Tobago.

3. This Ordinance shall commence on the 1st day of April, 1903.

Passed in Council this 23rd day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three.
