AN ORDINANCE relating to the Port-of-Spain Sewerage system.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.
Construction.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sewerage Rates Ordinance 1902, and shall be read with the Port-of-Spain Sewerage Ordinance 1901, hereinafter called the principal Ordinance.

Powers of
Governor in
Executive
Council.

2. Until the Board of Commissioners has been appointed by the Governor under Section 17 of the principal Ordinance the power to raise, levy and collect the sewerage rate contained in Section 25 of the said Ordinance shall be exercised by the Governor in Executive Council, who shall also until the appointment of the said Board exercise the several powers by the said Ordinance conferred on such Board; and the rate shall be collected by the Receiver-General and after providing yearly for the expenses of the maintenance of the sewerage system properly chargeable

to income shall be retained for the purpose of repayment of loans and the interest thereon as provided in and by the principal Ordinance.

3. The Engineer shall until the appointment of the Board as in Section 17 of the principal Ordinance provided exercise such of the powers vested in the Board under Sections 20, 22, 23 and 38 as might have been exercised by the Board, had such Board been appointed, which he may deem necessary to exercise. Powers of Engineer.

4. Any act requiring the sanction or approval of the Board under the provisions of the principal Ordinance may lawfully be permitted or approved by the Engineer until the said Board shall have been appointed. Idem.
