AN ORDINANCE to amend "The Port-of-Spain Streets Management Ordinance, 1900," (11-1900).

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

Short title. Construction. **1.** This Ordinance may be cited as "The Port-of-Spain Streets Management Ordinance, 1902." It shall be read and construed as one with "The Port-of-Spain Streets Management Ordinance, 1900."

Repeal. **2.** Section 18 of the Ordinance No. 11 of 1900 is hereby repealed, and instead thereof shall be read the following :—

Gutters, downfalls and pipes. The owner of every building abutting on any street in the town shall, to the satisfaction of the Town Superintendent, provide and at all times keep in proper repair order and condition suitable gutters, downfalls and pipes of unflammable materials for conveying the storm waters from the roof of such building or from any balcony, verandah,

shed or other projection forming part of such building to some canal, drain or pipe under the footway leading into the side drain of the street on which such building abuts.

In case the owner refuses, neglects or fails to provide or to repair and put in good order and condition such gutters, downfalls or pipes to the satisfaction of the Town Superintendent within two weeks after service upon such owner of a notice requiring him to do so, the owner of such building shall, for every day after the expiration of such period of two weeks during which such notice shall not be complied with, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings.

Passed in Council this ninth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two.
