AN ORDINANCE to amend the Roads Ordinances
1894—1904.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. After the word "expenditure" in the third line of Sub-section III of Section 9 of Ordinance No. 41—1895 shall be read the following:—

In case the said sums are not made good to such Board to the satisfaction of the Auditor-General within fourteen days after such certificate is given, the Attorney-General shall, in the name and on behalf of the Board, sue for the same in any Court of Civil Jurisdiction, and shall, if it appear to such Court that such expenditure was not authorized or was in contravention of any provisions of this Ordinance as aforesaid, be entitled to judgment

for the sum or sums so spent by any person or persons sued who may appear to have concurred in such expenditure, together with costs in the case as between Solicitor and Client.

The amount so recovered by the Attorney-General in any such action shall be forthwith paid over by him to the Board.

2. In Section 92 of the Roads Ordinance 1894, in lieu of the words "end of December" shall be read the words "end of March," and in lieu of the words "31st day of January" shall be read the words "30th day of April."

3. The Ordinance No. 8—1896 is hereby repealed.
