AN ORDINANCE to amend the Dogs Ordinance, 1895.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Dogs Ordinance 1904. It shall be read as one with the Dogs Ordinance 1895 (No. 7 of 1895) and the Dogs Ordinance 1898, (No. 10 of 1898). The two last mentioned Ordinances and this Ordinance may together be cited as the Dogs Ordinances 1895-1904.

Short title.  
Construction.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Dogs Ordinance 1895, the owner of any dog found in or upon any place other than private premises without having the label attached in the manner prescribed in the said Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and on conviction thereof before a Stipendiary Justice of the Peace shall for the first offence be liable to a fine not exceeding ten shillings and for a second and every subsequent offence to a fine not

exceeding twenty shillings, and in default of payment of any such penalty may be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding fourteen days.
