AN ORDINANCE relating to proceedings in the Port-of-Spain District Court prior to the 23rd day of March, 1903.

WHEREAS it is expedient that provision should be made for facilitating the enforcement of judgments recovered in the Port-of-Spain District Court previous to the 23rd day of March 1903, and for authorizing subsequent proceedings thereunder: Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Petty Civil Courts Ordinance 1904. It shall be read as one with the Petty Civil Courts Ordinance 1901, (No. 37—1901). The latter and this Ordinance may together be cited as the Petty Civil Courts Ordinances 1901 and 1904.

2. Whenever it shall be made to appear to a Judge of the Port-of-Spain District Court that the record of any judgment entered up in such Court prior to the 23rd day of March 1903, and which might lawfully be enforced, has been destroyed or cannot be found, it shall be lawful for such Judge upon such terms as to costs or otherwise as he may think fit to order that a new judgment be entered up in place of the judgment which has been destroyed or cannot be found.

3. Every such new judgment shall be entered up by the Clerk of the said Court, and thereafter all such proceedings may be taken thereon in the same manner as if such judgment were the original judgment entered up previous to the said 23rd day of March 1903.

Rules.

4. It shall be lawful for the Judges of the District Court of Port-of-Spain to make such rules as they may think expedient for the purpose of carrying into effect the objects of this Ordinance, and from time to time to amend, revoke and re-enact such rules as they may deem necessary.
