AN ORDINANCE relating to the appointment of Justices of the Peace.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Justices of the Peace (Appointment) Ordinance 1905. It shall be read as one with the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, No. 1. Short title. Construction.

2. Section 5 of the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance (No. 1) is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :— Repeal.

His Majesty may from time to time by Warrant under the hand of the Governor appoint any person or persons named in such warrant to be a Justice or Justices of the Peace for the whole Colony or for such districts or portions thereof as shall be expedient. Any person so appointed Appointment of Justices.

may be removed from the office of Justice of the Peace by a like warrant. A Justice of the Peace shall be so removed on being adjudicated a bankrupt.

All appointments of persons to be Justices of the Peace for the Island of Trinidad or for the whole Colony made previous to the commencement of this Ordinance shall be deemed to have been legally made, and all acts done by such persons in the exercise of their powers as Justices of the Peace shall be deemed to have been valid and legal.

Passed in Council this Second day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and five.
