AN ORDINANCE to provide for the fixing of Analytical Standards for Food and Drugs.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Food and Drugs (Standards) Ordinance 1905, and shall be read as one with the Food and Drugs Ordinance (No. 162), hereinafter called the principal Ordinance. Short title. Construction.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council by order from time to time to fix standards of purity for any article of food or any drug. Governor may fix standards.

3. Every such order shall be laid before the Legislative Council, and if not disapproved by resolution thereof within a period of one month, shall be published in the *Royal Gazette* and in at least one daily newspaper published in this Colony, and shall come into operation at such time as the Governor may by proclamation, to be similarly published, determine. Publication of order.

4. No person shall sell to the prejudice of the purchaser any article of food or drug which does not comply with the standard of purity fixed therefor under this Ordinance.

Any person contravening the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction shall be liable to the penalties prescribed by section 8 of the principal Ordinance.

Where no
standard fixed.

5. Any article of food or drug for which a standard is not fixed by order under Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be dealt with as provided by the principal Ordinance.

Passed in Council this Second day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and five.
