**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Con- Short title.  
viction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance 1905.

2. Section 135 of Ordinance No. 47 of 1895 is hereby Repeal.  
repealed and when the revised edition of Ordinances shall  
come into force Section 138 of number 1 thereof shall be  
deemed to be hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be  
read the following:—

Upon any appeal the Supreme Court may order the Costs on  
party against whom the same is decided to pay appeal.  
costs to the other party, such costs to be taxed  
by one of the Judges of the Supreme Court  
according to the Schedule of Fees hereunder  
and to be recoverable in the manner in this  
Ordinance provided.

3. It shall be lawful for any member of the Police Force to proceed against and any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace to convict any person guilty of assault notwithstanding that the party aggrieved may decline or refuse to prefer a complaint.
