AN ORDINANCE to repeal the Petty Civil Courts  
(Amendment) Ordinance (No. 281).

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. The Petty Civil Courts (Amendment) Ordinance <sup>Repeal.</sup>  
(No. 281) is hereby repealed.

The repeal by this section enacted shall not affect the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered or any right accrued or liability incurred before or any proceeding pending or uncompleted at the commencement of this Ordinance.
