AN ORDINANCE to give legislative sanction to certain expenditure from the funds of the Port-of-Spain Corporation.

[21st March, 1931.]

WHEREAS by section 121 of the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance, Cap. 224, expenditure of the funds or moneys of the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Port-of-Spain (hereinafter called the Corporation) is limited to certain purposes ;

And Whereas the sum hereinafter mentioned has been expended by the Corporation and doubts have arisen as to whether the whole or any part of such sum is included within such purposes ;

And Whereas it is expedient to settle such doubts and that such expenditure should have legislative sanction ;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Port-of-Spain Corporation (Validation of certain expenditure) Ordinance, 1931. Short title.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 121 of the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance, Cap. 224, the expenditure by the Corporation of the sum of £2,592 15s. 9½d., being the cost of sending a delegation to England in connection with the franchise of the Trinidad Electric Company Limited, shall be deemed to be good and valid. Validation of certain expenditure.
