AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Duties
Ordinance, Cap. 195.

[22nd May, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.
Construction.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties (Amendment) Ordinance, 1931, and shall be read as one with the Customs Duties Ordinance, Cap. 195, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment
of s. 6 of
Cap. 195.

2. Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following sub-section, the first part thereof being numbered accordingly:

Governor
may specify
capacities for
bottles, &c.

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in sub-section (1) of this section, it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation to

specify, in gallons and/or fractions of a gallon, uniform capacities for bottles, jars, or similar receptacles which contain spirits, wines, beer, ale, stout or porter in quantities which are within limits to be defined in such proclamation, in all cases where, in his absolute discretion, he shall consider that such bottles, jars or similar receptacles are reputed to be, or are sold as, bottles of standard sizes whether or not any statement of the actual contents is contained on any label or other attachment to or part of such bottle, jar or similar receptacle, and thereupon all bottles, jars, or similar receptacles, the capacities of which have been so specified, shall be deemed to contain not less than the quantity specified in each case.
