 AN ORDINANCE to amend the Cocoa Industry Relief
 Ordinance, 1930.

[8th June, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
 with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
 thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cocoa Industry ^{Short title.}
 Relief (Amendment) Ordinance, 1931, and shall be read
 as one with the Cocoa Industry Relief Ordinance, 1930, ^{Construction.}
 hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby ^{Purpose of}
 repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following: ^{advances.}

5. Subject to the provisions of any regulations
 made under this Ordinance, advances may be made
 to any owner at the discretion of the Committee
 for the maintenance and improvement of his land,

including the payment of labour and the purchase of supplies required to plant, cultivate and manure such land, and to reap and make merchantable the crop or produce thereof, and for no other purpose ; provided that

(1) advances shall not be made

(a) To the owner of any property which in the opinion of the Committee is under normal conditions of an uneconomic value ;

(b) To the owner who in the opinion of the Committee is able to meet the expenses referred to herein ;

(c) In excess of the amount actually required for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned.

(2) Advances to any owner during any one crop season shall not exceed in the aggregate the estimated value of the crop to be reaped from the land based on the prevailing market rates ascertained in the same manner as provided for in section 15 hereof.

Vouchers for
advances.

3. Section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting the following proviso :

Provided that no such vouchers shall be certified until the expiration of three clear days from the time of filing by the Registrar-General of the notification referred to in section 7 hereof.
