AN ORDINANCE for the incorporation of certain persons as Trustees of the Tackveeyatul Islamic Association of Trinidad.

[15th December, 1931.]

WHEREAS there has been established in the Colony an Association known as The Tackveeyatul Islamic Association of Trinidad (hereinafter called "the Association") which is representative of the Muslims in the Colony;

And whereas Gokool Meah of Diego Martin in the Island of Trinidad, Proprietor, and Abdul Ghany of St. Joseph in the said Island of Trinidad, Proprietor, have been appointed Trustees of the Association;

And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees for the time being of the Association should be incorporated and should have power to hold lands and other property in trust for the Association;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tackveeyatul Islamic Association of Trinidad (Incorporation) Ordinance, 1931. Short title.

2. The said Gokool Meah and Abdul Ghany and their successors in office as such Trustees as aforesaid shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Tackveeyatul Islamic Association of Trinidad" (hereinafter called "The Incorporated Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony and shall have and use a common seal, which may from time to time be changed by the Association. Incorporation of Trustees.

3. The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Association, have full power to acquire for the Association by purchase, exchange, demise, gift, bequest or otherwise, all lands or other property of what nature or kind soever in perpetuity or for a life or lives or for any term of years, and also any money, securities for money, goods or chattels whatsoever; and subject to such rules and regulations and control as aforesaid to take, hold and enjoy the same, and subject also to the performance of any trust upon which the said lands or other property, money, securities for money, goods or chattels may have been acquired. Trustees may acquire property.

4. It shall be lawful for the Incorporated Trustees, subject to such rules, regulations and control as aforesaid, from time to time by deed under their seal to sell or demise, grant, convey, exchange or otherwise dispose of any lands or other property vested or which may hereafter be vested in them. Trustees may dispose of property.

5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of His Majesty His Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other persons Saving of Crown and other rights.
