AN ORDINANCE to amend the Cocoa Industry Relief Ordinance, 1930.

[8th June, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cocoa Industry Relief (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1931, and shall be read as one with the Cocoa Industry Relief Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance. Short title. Construction. (36 of 1930.)

2. In lieu of the definition of "Owner" in section 2 of the Principal Ordinance shall be inserted the following :— Definition of "owner."

"Owner" means the owner of land planted in cocoa, or the duly authorized attorney of such owner, and includes an executor or administrator of a deceased owner, a trustee appointed by deed or will, and also a receiver appointed by an order of the Supreme Court or by a mortgagee.

3. Section 4 (2) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the words “(encumbrances created under the Agricultural Bank Ordinance, Cap. 132, excepted)” after the word “encumbered” in the sixth line thereof.

4. This Ordinance shall have retrospective effect, and shall be deemed to have commenced on the eighth day of June, 1931.
