AN ORDINANCE to amend the Registration of Electors
(Legislative Council) Ordinance, 1925.

[19th March, 1930.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of Short title.
Electors (Legislative Council) (Amendment) Ordinance, Construction.
1930, and shall be read as one with the Registration of
Electors (Legislative Council) Ordinance, hereinafter called 41-1925.
the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, Amendment
of s. 2 of
41 of 1925.
and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

Interpreta-
tion.

2. In this Ordinance—

“Order in Council” means the Order of His Majesty the King in Council dated the 16th day of April, 1924, and entitled “The Trinidad and Tobago (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924,” as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 30th day of July, 1928, and entitled “The Trinidad and Tobago (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1928;”

“District” means an electoral district as constituted by the Order in Council;

“Ward” means

(a) any Ward as defined by or under the Division of Trinidad Ordinance, 1926, and includes the Ward of Tobago; and

(b) any Ward as defined by or under the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance;

“Register” means a register of electors compiled in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

3. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

3.—(1) In the year 1932 and thereafter in such years as the Governor by proclamation may appoint, in no case being more than five years after the date of the last preceding general election of members of the Legislative Council, a register shall be compiled in each district of all persons entitled under the provisions of the Order in Council to vote at the election of a member of the Legislative Council for such district.

(2) Where a district consists of more than one Ward, the register shall be compiled in separate parts for each Ward included in such district.

(3) Each register compiled in accordance with this Ordinance shall come into force on the next ensuing first day of January and shall remain in force until the register next compiled comes into force.

(4) If for any reason a registration officer fails to compile a fresh register for any district or Ward, the register in force when the fresh register should have come into force shall continue in operation as the register for such district or Ward.

4. The following shall be substituted for Rule No. 26 Computation of time. in the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance :—

26. In reckoning time for the purposes of these Rules, Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Corpus Christi, and any other public holiday, shall be excluded ; and where anything required by these Rules to be done on any day falls to be done on any such excluded day, that thing may be done on the next day, not being one of such excluded days.
