AN ORDINANCE to amend the Lepers Ordinance.

[19th March, 1930]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Lepers Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1930, and shall be read as Construction. one with the Lepers Ordinance, hereinafter called the Cap. 100. Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Appointment of Officers and Servants. repealed, and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:

5. (1) The Governor may, in his discretion, appoint fit and proper persons to perform the duties of Medical Superintendent, Resident Superintendent, Matron, Assistant Matron, Dispenser-Steward and Assistant Dispenser-Steward of a Leper Asylum.

(2) The Surgeon-General may appoint such fit and proper persons as nurses, wardsmen, porters, cooks and other servants as may be necessary and may dismiss any such persons so appointed: Provided that in the case of any such appointment, the office or employment and the emoluments in connection therewith or the rate of wages payable shall have been previously sanctioned by the Governor: Provided also that any such person may appeal to the Governor against any order for such dismissal, and the Governor may make such order in the matter as to him shall seem fit.

(3) The Surgeon-General, subject to the direction of the Governor, shall have the control and direction of every Leper Asylum.

Penalties for
breaches of
rules.

3. Section 27 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting the following at the end thereof:—

Rules made under this section may contain provisions for the punishment of breaches of such rules or of misconduct, neglect or breach of duty by officers and servants by penalties not exceeding two pounds, to be awarded in such manner and by such officers as may be determined by such rules.

Provided that no officer or servant in receipt of a salary exceeding one hundred pounds a year shall be liable to any such penalty.
