AN ORDINANCE to amend the Pensions Ordinance.

[8th November, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1928, and shall be read as one Construction. with the Pensions Ordinance, hereinafter called the Cap. 83. Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 11 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Payments out of lunatic's pension. amended by adding the following proviso:—

Provided further that where any person to whom a pension has been granted has been adjudicated a lunatic in accordance with the provisions of the

Cap. 101.

Lunatics Ordinance, the Governor may deduct from the moneys payable to such person by way of pension such sum or sums as he may deem expedient and may apply the same for the maintenance and support of the wife or child of such lunatic.
