AN ORDINANCE to amend the Pensions Ordinance and to make provision for grant of a pension to a Governor in cases where he is eligible for a pension under the Pensions (Governors of Dominions, &c.) Acts.

[9th March, 1929.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.
Construction.*

Cap. 83.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929, and shall be read as one with the Pensions Ordinance, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of
s. 5 of Cap. 83.

2. To section 5 of the Principal Ordinance and at the end thereof the following proviso shall be added:—

“Provided further that if an officer becomes a Governor and on retirement in any circumstances is eligible for a pension under the Pensions (Governors of Dominions, &c.) Acts or any Act replacing or amending the same, he shall be eligible for a pension under this Ordinance and the regulations thereunder notwithstanding that such officer has not attained the age of fifty-five years.”
