AN ORDINANCE to amend the Plant Protection Ordinance.

[13th June, 1929.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Plant Protection
Construction. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929, and shall be read as one
Cap. 138. with the Plant Protection Ordinance, hereinafter called
the Principal Ordinance.

Definition of 2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby
"notifiable amended by inserting therein the following definitions:—
disease" and
"notifiable
pest."

"Notifiable disease" means any disease which the Governor may, by proclamation from time to time, declare to be a notifiable disease within the meaning of this Ordinance.

“Notifiable pest” means any pest which the Governor may, by proclamation from time to time, declare to be a notifiable pest within the meaning of this Ordinance.

3. The following section is inserted in the Principal Ordinance as section 11A :—

11A. The occupier, or if there be no occupier, the owner of any nursery, land or plantation in which any notifiable disease or notifiable pest occurs shall with all practicable speed give notice to the Chief Inspector or an Inspector of the occurrence of such notifiable disease or notifiable pest.

Owner or occupier to notify Inspector of notifiable disease or pest.

Such occupier or owner who fails to give such notice shall be liable on summary conviction before a Magistrate to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

If such occupier or owner is charged with failing to give such notice and it is proved that any notifiable disease or notifiable pest has occurred on his nursery, land or plantation, it shall lie on such occupier or owner to prove that he and the persons employed by him on such nursery, land or plantation took all reasonable steps to discover the occurrence of such notifiable disease or notifiable pest.
