AN ORDINANCE to amend the Governor's Salary Ordinance.

[4th June, 1927.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

Construction.

Cap. 3.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Governor's Salary (Amendment) Ordinance and shall be read as one with the Governor's Salary Ordinance hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

4. The Governor shall, when full pay leave is granted to him by the Secretary of State, receive salary at the rate of four thousand pounds per annum during any period or periods of absence. Such

leave shall not exceed six weeks for each period of twelve consecutive months resident service, and where such leave is spent in a place other than the Colony the time necessarily taken on the journey to and from such place (not exceeding the time necessarily taken in a passage to and from the United Kingdom) shall not be reckoned as leave.

3. This Ordinance shall operate retrospectively and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of January, 1927. ^{Retrospective provision.}

Passed in Council this twenty-seventh day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.
