AN ORDINANCE to amend the Pensions Ordinance.

[27th March, 1926.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions Short title.  
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, and shall be read as one Construction.  
with the Pensions Ordinance, hereinafter called the Cap. 83.  
Principal Ordinance.

2. The following section shall be inserted in the Principal Retirement for  
Ordinance as section 5A:— inefficiency.

Where an officer is removed from his office on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties thereof, and a pension, gratuity, or other allowance cannot otherwise be granted to him under the provisions of this Ordinance, the Governor in Executive Council, with the

approval of the Secretary of State, may if he considers it justifiable, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, grant such a pension, gratuity, or other allowance as he thinks just and proper, but in no case exceeding in amount that for which the officer would be qualified if he were suffering from some infirmity of mind or body likely to be permanent.

Passed in Council this nineteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six.
