AN ORDINANCE to amend the Medical Ordinance, No. 109.

[5th November, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Medical Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1924, and shall be read as one Construction. with the Medical Ordinance, No. 109, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. The following shall be inserted as section 40A of the Sale of quinine at certain Government Offices. Principal Ordinance:

40A. Notwithstanding anything in this Ordinance contained, it shall be lawful for any person authorised by the Colonial Secretary to sell

quinine at any Post Office, Constabulary Station or Warden's Office; provided that such Post Office, Constabulary Station or Warden's Office shall not be situated within two miles of the shop of any licensed druggist.
