AN ORDINANCE for the incorporation of certain persons as Trustees of the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad and Tobago.

WHEREAS by resolution duly passed on the 30th day of January, 1922, George Frederick Huggins of the City of Port-of-Spain, Merchant, Samuel Duncan Harding of the City of Port-of-Spain, Managing Attorney of the Trinidad Electric Co. Ltd., Robert Dickson Pringle of the City of Port-of-Spain, Representative of the National Council of the Young Men's Christian Association in London, Thomas Geddes Grant of the City of Port-of-Spain, Merchant, and John Walker Stephens of the City of Port-of-Spain, Merchant, were appointed and nominated by the Advisory Council of the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad as first Trustees of all the real and personal property of the said Association in the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago and they are desirous of being formed into a corporate body ;

And whereas it is expedient that the said George Frederick Huggins, Samuel Duncan Harding, Robert Dickson Pringle, Thomas Geddes Grant and John Walker Stephens should be incorporated;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad and Tobago (Incorporation) Ordinance, 1922.

Incorporation of Trustees. 2. George Frederick Huggins, Samuel Duncan Harding, Robert Dickson Pringle, Thomas Geddes Grant and John Walker Stephens and their duly appointed Successors as Trustees of the said Association shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad and Tobago" and by that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice in the Colony and shall have and use a common seal, which may from time to time be changed, but which common seal shall only be used in the presence of at least Three Trustees.

Provided that no such change shall be made except by a resolution of the members of the said Advisory Council convened for the purpose.

Trustees may acquire property. 3. The Incorporated Trustees of the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad and Tobago shall have full power to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or otherwise any real or personal property in this Colony or any estate or interest therein.

Trustees may dispose of property. 4. The Incorporated Trustees of the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad and Tobago shall be entitled to sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may for the time being be vested in or have been acquired by the said Trustees.

5. No change of the persons incorporated as Trustees under this Ordinance shall affect any real or personal property or any interest therein which may for the time being be vested in the Incorporated Trustees of the Young Men's Christian Association in Trinidad and Tobago, but such property or any estate or interest therein shall vest in the succeeding persons who may from time to time be appointed Trustees by the said Advisory Council in the same way and to the same extent that they were vested in the former Trustees.
