AN ORDINANCE to continue in force sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Government Currency Notes (Amendment) Ordinance, 1920.

[20th March, 1923.]

WHEREAS sub-section (2) of section 2 of the Government Currency Notes (Amendment) Ordinance, 1920, (hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance) provides that the said section shall remain in force for the period of three years from the date of the commencement of the said Ordinance and no longer, that is to say, for the period of three years from the 26th day of March, 1920 ;

And whereas it is expedient that sub-section (1) of the said section should be continued in force for a further period of three years ;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Government Short title. Currency Notes Ordinance, 1923.

Repeal. 2.—(1) Sub-section (2) of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Sub-sec. (1) of s. 2 of Ord. 4—1920 continued in force. (2) Sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance shall continue in force for three years from the date of the commencement of this Ordinance.
