AN ORDINANCE to continue in force the Industrial Court Ordinance, 1920.

[21st April, 1922.]

WHEREAS section 1 of the Industrial Court Ordinance, 1920 (hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance) provided that the Ordinance should expire on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-one;

And whereas Ordinance No. 39 of 1921 provides that the Principal Ordinance shall continue until the 30th day of June, 1922, and shall then expire, unless further continued;

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Ordinance should continue in force until repealed;

Be it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Industrial Court (Continuance) Ordinance, 1922.

Repeal. 2.—(1) The words “and shall expire on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-one” in section 1 of the Principal Ordinance and Ordinance No. 39 of 1921 are hereby repealed.

force.** (2) The Principal Ordinance shall, subject to any amendments which may from time to time be made thereto, continue in force until the same shall be repealed.
