AN ORDINANCE to amend the Detention of Habitual
Criminals Ordinance, 1921.

[23rd September, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Detention of Short title.
Habitual Criminals (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922, and
shall be read as one with the Detention of Habitual Construction.
Criminals Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter called the Principal (1-1921.)
Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (2) of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance, Who is to be
deemed a
habitual
criminal.
which reads as follows:—

(2) A person shall be deemed to be a habitual
criminal who has at least four times previously
to the conviction on the said indictment been

convicted on indictment of a crime, whether any such previous conviction was before or after the commencement of this Ordinance.

is hereby amended so as to read as follows:—

- (2) A person shall be deemed to be a habitual criminal who has at least four times previously to the conviction on the said indictment been convicted of a crime, whether any such previous conviction was before or after the commencement of this Ordinance.
